Communication ipads

We all know how important communication skills are for everyone for a range of purposes including to greet others, to make requests, to comment, to ask questions, to protest, and to share information. This term we have been fortunate enough to purchase communication iPads with Proloquo2Go for all our staff. This means that we now have 3 iPads in each class dedicated to communication, with staff able to model language to students throughout the day including in the classroom, in the playground and out in the community.

Students are of course encouraged to bring their own communication device to school each day.



Self Regulation and Engagement

At Suneden, safety of students is a priority and we aim to provide a safe physical and emotional environment for our students. We understand the importance of building positive connections with our students and supporting students to be regulated by ensuring they have access to a range of regulation tools. We know that only after these things are in place, can successful learning happen in the classroom. This 'Model of Child Engagement' from Greg Santucci summarises our approach at Suneden, and we wanted to share it with you today.


End of Day Routine

If you collect your child at the end of the day, you may have noticed that we have music playing in the hallways. As you know, we don't have bells and sirens as these can upset or trigger some of our students, but we thought it would be helpful for students to have something which alerts them to the fact that it's time to go out to the buses and get ready to go home. This new initiative has been well received by the students and is supporting the development of independence in our students.



State Government Capital Grant

Late last year, we were fortunate enough to receive a State Government Capital Grant of \$73250. The grant has been put toward a number of improvements across the school including new classroom furniture in Senior Pink class, shelving in the gym store room, extension of the covered walkway out to the bus area, repairs to the paving in the staff car park and to the hallway vinyl, and a new warning system for evacuations and lockdowns. We have also been able to purchase a portable Smartboard for the student kitchen, and a 'Magic Mirror' for the sensory room.

Principal's Award


Well done Ryan from Middle Yellow.



mirror.




<u>Maths</u>
